HOOVER'S CEMETERY

Hoover's Cemetery, known also as Mount Hope, and Athens Cemetery, is on the north side of SR-14, about three-tenths of a mile east of 650E - a few hundred feet east of the town of Athens, Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana. A sign at the entrance reads "Hoover Cemetery, 1891."

Land for this cemetery was donated by Henry Hoover and William Rannells. William Rannells and his wife Susan were originally from Virginia, but removed to Ohio where they remained for some time before moving on to settle east of Athens, between Rochester and Akron, in Fulton Co., Ind. They brought with them a young slave girl, Fannie Rose, who died in 1855. She was buried in the Rannells family burial ground which was later made a part of Hoover's cemetery.

The Rannells house, home of William Rannells, and later used as a tavern or inn, was probably thirty rods, a little south & east of the old Mount Hope church, which was at the south-east corner of the cemetery. Traces of the old church foundation are still visible. (*Fulton Co Ind Hist Soc Quarterly*, Dec. 1968 (No. 2), pp. 5-6, 15; also Marguerite Miller, *Home Folks*, Vol. 2, p. 93).

The cemetery is divided into four sections: North, South, East and West. Rows run north and south; rows are numbered from west to east; stones read from north to south. Readings made in 1974, 1975 and 1991.

Wm. Rannells, Long Billy, had m. in Virginia to his cousin, Susan Rannells (b.1803), and when they removed to Ohio they took with them a little slave girl, Fannie Rose, who did not wish to be separated from them. This family remained in Ohio until 1838, at which time they moved to Fulton Co Ind, settling near what is now Athens. The family grave yard is now a part of what is known as Hoover's cemetery, also called Mount Hope cemetery. The burial place of Susan Rannells, wife of Wm., was not located in this cemetery. However, *The Rochester Sentinel*, April 20, 1861 gives the following: "Died - On the morning of the 17th inst., at her residence in Rochester, Mrs. Susan Rannells, aged 58 years, 7 months, and 14 days."

Susan Rannells and Robert N. Rannells were named the Admrs of the Estate of William Rannells, August 15, 1850 (November Term 1849), and this estate was not settled for some time. It remained in the Docket Book until the July Term 1856 (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Court Records*).

Children of Wm. & Susan Rannells included the following: James W., b.1823 Virginia; Eliza Ann, b.ca.1825 Ohio (m. (1st) 1845, Lyman Brackett; m. (2nd) 1848, John H. Harter, Cindarella, and William); Elmira, b.ca.1836, Ohio; Amanda, b.ca.1838, Ohio; Jacob S., b.ca.1840, Ind; Emily Christina, b.1843, d.1849.

The church and cemetery are on land that was purchased by Solomon Melvin and wife in 1837. His nephew, Jacob Melvin, who came with him from Ohio, died soon after at the age of twenty-one, and was the first to be buried in this cemetery, according to records of Velma Bright, Librarian, Akron (Henry Township) Carnegie Public Library.

[NOTE: Katharine (also Catharine) Sheets, b.ca.1794 No.Car. came to Ohio at an early date, and was perhaps the third wife of Philip Rader, Sr., of Montgomery Co Ohio. The *Census, 1850* tells that all the children in the family were b. Ohio; also, David "Capt", the eighth child in this family, was b. Montgomery Co Ohio, a son of Philip, Sr., and Katharine (Sheets) Rader, indicating that the marriage of Philip & Katharine took place in Ohio.

Philip Rader, Sr., was b. August 12, 1782, at Bells Knob, Wythe Co Virginia, and was an Ohio Vet. of the War of 1812. He removed to Ohio in 1803, settling in Montgomery Co. According to tradition, the Rader ancestors - father, mother and three sons, Connrad, Jasper & John, left Germany to come to America ca.1750. The parents d. and were bur at sea, and the sons went to Virginia and on their separate ways. The Indiana branch does not know anything about them.

Fulton Co Ind history tells that Philip Rader, Sr. was m. (1st) to Miss Cress who died; and that there were four children born who also died (Rader family history says her name was Cross). No marriage record has been located to prove or disprove that statement. There is proof of the (2nd) marriage of Philip Rader to Elizabeth Siddon, January 30, 1812 (L. D. M. Brien, *Montgomery Co Ohio Marriages 1803-1851*). Elizabeth Rader, wife of Philip, d.1824, at age 32 years, and is bur in Old Mill Creek cem, Butler Twp, Montgomery Co Ohio (L.D.M. Brien, *Montgomery Co Ohio Cem Records*, p. 153)

Philip Rader, Sr., and his (third?) wife, Katharine (Sheets) Rader came to Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in 1842. They are householders of that twp & county in *Census, 1850* with five children.

Philip Rader, Sr., d. November 2, 1853, at age 72y-2m-21d, and is bur in Sugar Grove cem, Butler Twp, Montgomery Co Ohio (L. D. M. Brien, *Montgomery Co Ohio Cem Records*, kp. 162). His will, dated October 29, 1853, proven December 12, 1853, and admitted to probate at Dayton, Montgomery Co Ohio, and recorded at Rochester, Fulton Co Ind, April 4, 1854, leaves his estate to "my children": Chnthian Julien; Mary Pearson; Catharine Jenkins; Andrew Rader; Henry Rader; Julien Rader; Bethany Stephens; "the heirs of my dau Henrietta Fentriss"; "the heirs of my dau Eliza Jane Ball"; son, David; dau Barbara Rader; son, Philip Rader (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Wills*).

Henrietta, dau of Philip, Sr., and Elizabeth (Siddon) Rader, m. September 22, 1837 to Joseph Fentress (L. D. M. Brien, *Montgomery Co Ohio Marriages 1803-1851*). Joseph Fentres, age 34, b. Ohio, & Henrietta, 33, householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in *Census, 1850*, had children: Philip, 10 b. Ohio; (J. or I.) A., 8 b. Ohio; Jas., 6 b. Ind; Catharine, 5 b. Ind; Elizabeth, 3 b. Ind; and Davis, 10 months b. Ind. There was not found a record of this Fentres family in Henry Twp, *Census, 1860*. There is a record of a Joseph Fenters marriage to Clarissa Strong, March 14, 1858 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Joseph & Clarissa, both 54, and both b. Ohio, were householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in the *Census, 1870*, with Davis 20, and Martha E. 10. Joseph Fenters, age 64, b. Ohio (parents both b. So. Car) "widowed" was living with the household of Isaac & Lydia Sears in Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in *Census, 1880*.

Bethany Christine, dau of Philip, Sr., and Katharine (Sheets) Rader, m. October 31, 1844 to Jacob Stevens (L. D. M. Brien, *Montgomery Co Ohio Marriages, 1803-1851*). Since Philip Rader, Sr., and his family had already gone to Ind, it is possible that Bethany remained in Ohio, but not certain.

December 4, 1862, Fulton C Ind, lived in the home of her uncle William Huling, in Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind per *Census*, 1870, after the death of her parents. She is listed as Mary E. in this record. Mary E. Huling m. 1880 to Charles F. Hoover (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Charles F. Hoover, b. 1857 Miami Co Ind, was the youngest child of Daniel C. & Frances (Shrofe) Hoover who were of Miami Co Ohio, but removed to Miami Co Ind ca. 1839. Charles F. Hoover entered the mercantile business at Akron Ind in 1881.]

Fielden Clevenger, age 59 b.Virginia, was a resident of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, per *Census, 1850*. With him were two of his children: David 20, and nancy 18, and two grandchildren, David & Mary Staton, ages 9 and 8 respectively, both b.Ind. David & Mary Staton were raised by their grandparents, the Fieldon Clevengers - their father, Thomas Staton (Stayton), b.1811, having d. when they were minors. (Shirley Willard, *Fulton Co Folks, Vol. 1*, p. 116).

Fielden Clevenger later made his home with Thomas Clevenger who possibly was a son. Thomas m. Maria Swyhart, December 22, 1850 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Thomas, age 35 b. Ohio, and Maria, 36 b. Ohio, were residents of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, per *Census, 1860*, with: Susan Swinehart, 19 b. Ohio; Fielden Clevenger, 68 b. Penn; and Mary Staton, 15, b. Ind.

Caleb Stradley, Sr., age 64 b.Delawar, was a resident of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, per *Census, 1850*. He had no wife in this record, but listed several of his children: Caleb, Jr. (idiotic), 26 b.Delaware, d.1851; Susanna E., 19 b.Ohio, d.1851; Peter, 15, b.Ohio, d.1851; Luther, 12. b.Ind. The relationship of two more in this household in now known - perhaps they are grandchildren: Rachael (J. or I.), 6, b.Illinois; Sarah C., 1, b.Ind.

Luther Stradley, son of Caleb, Sr., first white child b.Henry Twp, m.Sarah Jane Moore, October 19, 1856. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Luther was a Cpl. in Co D, 87 Regt. (Historical Atlas, *Fulton Co Ind*, by Kingman Bros, 1883, p. 15). Luther, age 23, and Sarah 24 b.Ohio, were residents of Newcastle Twp, Fulton Co Ind per *Census, 1860*, with children: George 3, Isaac 2, and Charles 9 months. The *Census, 1870* places Luther & Sarah J. Stradley in Henry Twp, with children: Isaac 12, Phillip 8, John I. 3, William N. 2 months (birth in April), and an adult, Mary Moore 65 b.Virginia.

Caleb Stradley, Sr., had other children already married before the *Census, 1850*. John Stradley (b.ca.1809 Maryland) might be a son. He was a householder in Henry Twp according to *Census 1850*. James H. Stradley (b.1821 Delaware might also be a son.

Charles J. "Squire" Stradley, son of Caleb, Sr. & Susan, was b.October 14, 1814 Kent Co Delaware, and d.March 11, 1887 at Rochester, at age 73. (*Fulton Co Ind D.R.*). Rachel Pontious, dau of Isaac & Magdalena (Wolhete Pontious, m. February 17, 1856, Abraham Pontius (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*), his second wife, and had eleven children. Abraham Pontius was a son of Nicholas & Eve (Buchter) Pontius of Penn, b. 1831 in Stark Co Ohio, and

m.1853 (1st) to Christina Kreighbaum in Elkhart, Ind. His first wife d.1854, leaving a dau, Sarah.

Another son of Solomon & Magdalena (Kreighbaum) Puntious was Moses Pontious, b.1832, Stark Co Ohio. He m.1852 Sarah Ann Eberhardt, and they removed to Ind in 1869, and settled in Henry Twp, Fulton Co. They are householders of that county & twp in *Census, 1870 and 1880*.

Joseph Puntious was another son of Solomon & Magdalena (Kreighbaum) Puntious, and was b.ca.1837 Ohio. No other info has been found concerning him.

Hester "Hettie" Pontious, dau of Solomon & Magdalena (Kreighbaum) Puntious, was b. March 27, 1838/37, and m.March 4, 1860, Adam Hoffman. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Adam Hoffman, b. October 20, 1835 Stark Co Ohio, son of Jacob & Magdalena Hoffman, was a resident of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in the *Census, 1870*, with Hettie, his wife (b. Ohio), and two children: Alsines E. Another son, Daniel 1835-1920, appears to be unmarried, and his household in 1870 included Mary N. 67 years (his mother, Nettie M.) and Deby A. age 21 (probably his youngest sister). (*Census, 1870*, Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind). *Fulton Co Ind M.R.* reveal that Debyan Melvin m. Geo. W. Alspach, October 12, 1871.]

Children of Benjamin & Sarah Royer, as they appear in the two census records for 1860 & 1870, were: Amanda b.ca.1855, Martha b.ca.1857, Sarah b.ca.1858, Samuel b.1860, Israel b.1862, d.1864 (not in census record, but see following), Jesse b.1864, George b.ca.1866, and Reuben 1869-1951.

Samuel, son of Benjamin & Sarah Royer, m. Mary E. Miller, November 27, 1884. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Obit, Carl L. Royer, formerly of Akron d. in the Marion veterans hospital where he had been a patient 40 years. He was a veteran of WW1. Carl Lee Royer b.1887, son of Samuel & Mary (Miller) Royer, had survivors: sister, Mrs. William Overly, of Peru, and a brother, Orville Royer, Big Springs, Texas. (*The Sentinel*, Rochester, Ind., July 5, 1972). Samuel Royer was the first child of Benjamin & Sarah Royer to be b. Ind - the older children having been b. Ohio.

Fulton co Ind B.R. report that Jesse and Susan Lovina (Landis) Royer had a son, Benjamin Franklin Royer, b. April 4, 1906.

Reuben Royer, son of Benjamin & Sarah (Price) Royer, was b. January 18, 1869, three miles east of Akron where he d. October 19, 1951. He m. Ellora (also called Nerla) Hoffman March 15, 1900. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Reuben & Nerla had children: Robert A., b. September 22, 1902; Vern, of Akron; and John Newton, b. July 18, 1913, d. October 13, 1913. Reuben Royer was the last of a family of eight children. (*The News-Sentinel*, Rochester, Ind., Oct. 19, 1951; *Fulton Co Ind B.R.*).]

WHITTENBERGER CEMETERY

An old burial ground, now abandoned, was once on the old Jacob Whittenberger farm, also known as Century Farm, more recently known as the Michael Porter farm, and was known as the "Old Whittenberger Cemetery." It was located about two hundred feet northwest of the Akron sewer pumping building, north of SR-14 at the west edge of Akron, Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana.

A part of the old iron fence and one marker are all that remain.

(this marker, the only one found by these compilers in 1975, was placed there by Sylvia Noyer when she had a new marker place in the Akron Cemetery for Donald O. and Sarah Delta Noyer)

Manitou Chapter DAR, *Genealogical Survey, Fulton Co Ind Cemeteries*, 1935, recorded the following:

WELTON, Asher, Soldier War of 1812, d. Aug 1838

WELTON, Ada Low, dau of Anthony Low, Revolutionary Soldier, d. 1842
(no age or b.d.)

[NOTE: The first death in Akron (known then as Newark), was that of Miss Adeline Welton in the fall of 1836, which was followed in a few days with the death of her sister, Fannie. (Barnhart, *History of Fulton Co Ind*, 1923, p. 139.)]

[NOTE: *The Akron News*, November 17, 1893 tells the following:

"Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Sippy of Richland Co Wisconsin are here visiting their old friends and relatives, the Whittenbergers & Sippys. Mrs. Sippy's maiden name was Laura Welton and she was the first white child born in Henry Twp, occurring 56 years ago in a log cabin that stood in the yard where Eliza Slaybaugh's house now stands.

[Kate (Morris) Jennens told Jean C. Tombaugh, compiler of this book, in 1976 that the above-mentioned Eliza Slaybaugh's house was the "present" home of Josephine Slaybaugh Merley.]

"Her parents and three sisters are buried on Jacob Whittenberger's farm north of the house, the last one, a sister dying buried there 48 years ago. The spot has been carefully guarded all these years, first by fence which decayed and latterly Mr. Whittenberger has placed stones over the graves to mark and protect them with a neat iron fence. Mr. Sippy enjoys a prominent place in his Wisconsin home having served as sheriff & othr positions of trust."

[NOTE: Asher Welton, lhis wife and ten children are said to have arrived in Fulton County, Ind., in June 1836. They came with Dr. Joseph Sippy, William Whittenberger, Henry Bristol, Moses Worden, Uriah Bragg and their families, and Nathaniel Cogshall an unmarried man. The first purchase of land in Fulton County to be made by Asher Welton "of Kosciusko

County" was 80 acres in Henry Twp (T30R4E) on September 21, 1837. He died soon after, and his estate was "Settled Up" by Alfred T. Welton on November 11, 1839. Records indicate that the wife of Asher Welton was Ada (Adah J.) Low, dau of Anthony Low, Revolutionary war soldier.

We know for certain that Asher & Adah J. (Low) Welton had children: Adaline, b.ca.1817; Fanny, b.ca.1819; Julia; Asher, Jr.; Isaac; Celia S.; Laura E., b.May 17, 1837, first child born to white parents in Henry Twp. Alfred T., Hiram Low, Ransom M. and Seymour J. Welton were all householders of Fulton Co Ind, in 1840 and may have been older sons of Asher Welton. Their relationship to Asher Welton has not been determined. Alfred T. and Ransom M. Welton both appear to have married before coming to Fulton Co Ind, and Hiram Low Welton married soon after they arrived here.

The birth date of Alfred T. Welton is not known, however he is said to have come to Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in 1837, and was first postmaster of Wesley - later called Akron. He was deceased by March, 1849, and Lot N. Bozarth was named Admr. of his estate. Name of the wife of Alfred T. Welton is unknown, however inscription on the grave marker for Minerva Osgood, wife of Melancton Osgood, tells that she was a dau of A. T. & S. Welton. Semantha Welton age 60 (b.ca.1790 N.Y.) who was living in the household of Lot N. & Clarissa Jane Bozarth, in Rochester Twp in the *Census, 1850*, might be the wife of Alfred T. Welton, but needs a little more proof. *Fulton Co Ind Estate Book "A"*, p. 364 reveals the names of the heirs of Alfred T. Welton: (Polly M. (also called Mary Ann & Minerva), although not in the Estate Book mentioned above, should be named first because of her age - b.1825, d.1854 - was b.New York, and m. in Fulton Co Ind, to Melancton Osgood December 29, 1842. She died leaving small children: George N., b.ca.1845, Miron T., b.ca.1847, L. G. "Gardner" b.ca.1850, and Mary L. Osgood.); Grant; Caroline T., b.ca.1834 Ohio, probably living at age 16 with Semantha Welton (age 60) in the household of Lot T. and Clarissa Jane Bozarth in Rochester Twp in 1850, and m. Cyrus H. Robbins, November 18, 1852 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*); Chauncy R.; Melancton; Orange (J.?).

Hiram Low Welton was of Medina Co Ohio, when he purchased 80 acres of land in Henry Twp on March 25, 1836 (*Fulton Co Ind Early Tract Book*). His marriage to Hannah Sippy at the cabin of Dr. Sippy on January --, 1838, was the first marriage of Henry Twp. She was a dau of Dr. Joseph Sippy.

Ransom M. Welton, who may have been a son of Asher Welton, was b. May 15, 1815, and d. October 27, 1845 at age 30y-5m-12d. He purchased 40 acres land in Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, September 21, 1837. His wife, Elsie M. (also calld Elcy, Elsa and Elizabeth M.), b. September 1, 1813 in N.Y., and d. August 4, 1867 at age 53y-11m-4d, m. (2nd) to Wm. Whittenberger, Jr., December 18, 1845 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Wm. Whittenberger & Elsa M. Whittenberger were named Admrs. of the Estate of Ransom M. Welton deceased, January 30, 1846 (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Early Court Records*). Wm. & Elsa M. Whittenberger, Jr., were residents of Henry Twp in *Census, 1850*. Their household included the children of Ransom M. Welton, first husband of Elsa M. Whittenberger. These children are also listed in *Estate Book A*, p. 129: Cordelia, b.ca.1836 Ohio, prob. m. December 16, 1855 John A. Hale, as per *Fulton Co Ind M.R.*; Harriet, b.ca.1838 Ind; Samantha, b.ca.1839 Ind; Harrison (Tyler), b.ca.1841 Ind; Clarissa, b.ca.1844 Ind; Celastina, b.ca.1845 Ind. After the death of his wife, Elsa M., Wm. Whittenberger, Jr. m. Hannah Strong, May 11, 1868 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*).

Clarissa Jane Welton (parentage unknown) b.ca.1820 N.Y., m. December 7, 1837 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*) to Lot N. Bozarth, b.ca.1813 Virginia. Two children were born: Caroline D., b.ca.1848 Ind; Nelson J., b.ca.1850 Ind. Lot N. & Clarissa Jane Bozarth were residents of Rochester Twp in *Census, 1850*. This household included their two children, and also Semantha Welton age 60 and Caroline Welton age 16. Lot N. Bozarth d. and lettrs of Adm were filed on April 8, 1856. During the February Term 1858, Fulton Co Ind, a complaint was

filed by Daniel D. Pratt -vs- Clarissa J. Bozarth as Admx of the Estate of Lot N. Bozarth, deceased, and as widow of said deceased, and Nelson J. Bozarth child of deceased; Guardian-ad-litem was appointed for N. J. Bozarth (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Court Records*). Clarissa Jane (Welton) Bozarth m. next to John Stevens, March 6, 1858 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). On July 17, 1860, a complaint for foreclosure of mortgage was filed by John Stephens & Clarissa J. Stephens against Norman & Dincy Loomis; and during August Term, 1865, Clarissa J. Stevens Admrx -vs- Heirs of Lot N. Bozarth, deceased, petitions to sell land. (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Court Records*).

Charlott D. Welton (parentage unknown) was the first wife of Jesse Shields, early pioneer of Fulton Co Ind. They were m. June 13, 1844 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Charlott D. (Welton) Shields d. 1844, and Jesse Shields m. 1846 (2nd) to Margaret J. Robbins, and m. 1872 (3rd) to Margaret McClung. Although the birth date of Charlott D. (Welton) Shields is not known, we do know that Jesse Shields was b. September 15, 1820. (Peattie, *History of Fulton Co Ind*, p. 129; *Fulton Co Ind Historical Society Quarterly*, June 1966, pp. 3-6).]

JAMES CURTIS FARM CEMETERY

The old James Curtis farm cemetery, on the Norman Benson farm one mile west of Akron, south of SR-14 in a field behind the farm home, in Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana.

It is surrounded by a concrete wall; rows run north and south; rows are numbered from east to west; stones read from north to south.

DANIEL McINTIRE FARM CEMETERY

The old Daniel McIntire farm cemetery, now the Donald McIntire farm, is located on the north side of the old Fort Wayne Road, about 500 feet east of 825E, in Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana.

It has been long abandoned, terribly damaged by livestock and weather.

Richard McEntire, age 25 b. Ohio, and Sarah, age 21 b. Ind, appear as householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind in *Census, 1860*. They are recorded again in *Census, 1870*, and with them is the mother of Sarah at age 68. Sarah (Hoover) McIntire's will, dated April 1, 1871 and proved November 7, 1873, leaves her estate to her "beloved husband Richard McIntire." (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Wills*). The will of Jacob Hoover of Fulton Co Ind, father of Sarah (Hoover) McIntire, was dated August 7, 1860 and proven April 16, 1861. It tells that the testator died on April 11, 1861, and names his heirs: his wife, Sarah Hoover; son, Eli Hoover and his two children William & Alma; his dau, Sarah McIntyre wife of Richard McIntyre; dau, Marny (or Marina?) Hoover. (*Ibid*). Sarah (Hoover) McIntire's parents were both b. No. Car, Jacob in 1797, and Sarah (Sr.) in 1801 (*Census, 1860*, Henry Twp, Fulton co Ind).]

His name was recorded in the list of householders of Henry Twp in *Census, 1840, 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880*. These indicate that he was b.ca.1802 Virginia, and his wife Mary was b.ca.1805 Ohio. These records also record the names of children in this family: Jacob b.ca.1828 Ohio; Augustus b.ca.1829 Ohio; Elliott b.ca.1831 Ohio; Dan'l b.ca.1832 Ohio; Richard b.ca.1834 Ohio; Joseph b.ca.1838 Ohio; Thomas b.ca.1840 Ind; Reubin b.ca.1848 Ind and Alfred b.ca.1850 Ind. The last two children were missing from the family in 1860.

Jacob, son of Daniel and Mary McIntire, was probably the same Jacob McIntire who m. Anna Kysinger, June 13, 1852 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Anna could belong in the family of Philip Kysinger (b.ca.1785 Penn) and his wife, Christenia (b.ca.1790 Penn), who were householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in *Census, 1850*, with a family which included: Catharine age 25, Anna 21, Mary 19 and Margaret 17, all b. Ohio. This family appears to have left by 1860. The will of Christena Kysinger "of Kosciusko Co Ind" dated April 4, 1881, proven August 29, 1884, Fulton Co Ind, "late of said county, deceased," names her heirs: William E. Wood (heir of her dau, Barbara Wood); son, Samuel Kysinger; dau, Mary Heckathorn; son, Jacob Kysinger; dau, Elizabeth Scott; dau, Catharine Laur; dau, Amy (or

Any?) McIntire; dau, Sarah Blue; son, Henry Kisinger; dau, Margaret Swatzlander (Jean C. Tombaugh, *Fulton Co Ind Wills*).

Augustus McIntire, son of Daniel & Mary McIntire, b.ca.1829 Ohio, m. Margaret (b.ca.1845 Ind). They were in the list of householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, in *Census, 1870*. Their family included: Richard age 7, James F. age 5, Mary age 6 months (b.November, and also a William Maggart age 12 years. (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.* reveal that Augustus McIntyre m. Margaret A. White, November 27, 1860.

Elliott McIntire, son of Daniel & Mary McIntire, b.ca.1831 Ohio, m. Leah Woods, August 6, 1854 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). Elliott and Leah McIntire were householders of Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, *Census, 1860 and 1870*. The children in this family were: Elize A. b.ca.1855; Reubin 1856-1926; Thomas b.ca.1858; Daniel b.ca.1860; Sarah b.ca.1862; Elijah b.ca.1865 (of Hoover's Station, m. Lillie Newell, 1894); Rosetta b.September, 1869.

Daniel H. McIntire, son of Daniel & Mary McIntire, was b.ca.1832 Ohio. He m. Rosana Bryant February 15, 1853 (*Fulton Co Ind M.R.*). AKRON CITIZENS CEMETERY

The cemetery is located at the northwest corner of the intersection of SR-19 and the Erie Lackawanna Railroad, at Akron, Henry Township, Fulton County, Indiana. An iron fence along the front (eastern side) of the cemetery bears a date, 1893.

The town of Newark (later known as Akron), Henry Twp, Fulton Co Ind, was laid out in 1838 by Dr. Joseph Sippy and Hiram Welton, and in 1840 the first public cemetery, regularly deeded for that purpose, was donated by Dr. Sippy. It is known as the "Old Cemetery," or the "Akron Citizens Cemetery." (Kingman Bros., *Historical Atlas, Fulton County, Ind.*, 1883, p. 35).

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
