Richard Lee Sayger

Richard Lee "Dick" SAYGER, 24, R.R. 1, Akron, was killed instantly at 3:38 a.m. Wednesday when his car went off a curve on Ind. 25 two miles southwest of Warsaw in Kosciusko county. He was the son of Maurice and Irene MILLER SAYGER.

The valdeictorian of his 1962 Akron high school class and a former varsity basketball player, Sayger died of a broken neck and skull fracture according to Dr. A. L. MOSER, Kosciusko county coroner.

Sayger was driving south when he lost control of his car while rounding a curve. The convertible went off the road, hit a utility pole, traveled 90 feet, went into a ditch and flipped onto its top. Sayger, who was wearing a seatbelt, was trapped in the car.

Born In Rochester March 19, 1944, Sayger received two scholarships to Purdue university's school of engineering upon graduation frrom high school. He transferred to Anderson college to major in education and had just enrolled at Mahchester college to complete the eight hours of study needed for a degree in education. He would have started classes Monday. He was employed at the Warsaw plant of R. R. Donnelley and Sons while not attending school.

Jorgen M. Christiansen

Jorgen M. CHRISTIANSEN, who won international fame as a circus animal trainer, died unexpectedly early Sunday morning at his home at 1121 Washington street. He was 84 years old.

Cause of death was not determined immediately, but is believed to have been either from a coronary attack or a stroke. Mr. Christiansen had been in good health and just three weeks ago had visited the Circus Museaum at Baraboo, Wis., where he was a special guest at the Museum's anniversary celebration.

A member of the Circus Hall of Fame at Sarasota, Fla., Mr. Christiansen retired in 1957 after a 53-year career on the sawdust circuit in three continents.

Considered one of the premier horse trainers of recorded circus history, Mr. Christiansen first came to Rochester in 1937 to join the Cole Brothers Circus that then was winter-quartered here. It was at this time he developed his famous horse act consisting of 24 Palominos. No one has duplicated it since.

Born in Helsingor, Denmark, Mr. Christiansen began his circus career in 1904 at the age of 20, with Circus Helvetia in Denmark. He soon began training horses and was so successful that he became one of the outstanding horses trainers in Europe. During the Russian Revolution of 1917, the circus with which he was traveling was cut off from western Europe by the fighting and he had to follow a dangerous, circuitous route to regain safety.

He was brought to America in 1923 by Ringling Brothers Barnum & Bailey Circus and for four years was the top attraction of the "Greatest Show on Earth," operating the country's first 24-horse Liberty Act from the center ring.

For the 1927 season he invented a carousel act that hasn't yet been copied. It included 79 animals, including zebras, camels, 39 horses and 29 ponies.

Noted for his kindness to the animals he trained, Mr. Christiansen performed with eight circus troupes in his long career and trained many breeds of animals with great success. Among others best remembered were he famous eight Creamoline stallions and 10 Argentina Criollo horses, and a "Storybook Review" which included Palomino, pony, donkey, goat, collie and elkhound. The latter was his final act, which he sold to Cristiani circus upon his retirement in 1957 at the age of 73.

Mr. Christiansen's Hall of Fame citation noted that "the great originality and beauty that characterized his presentation, plus the superb showmanship and personality of the man himself, has raised Jorgen Christiansen to the top rank of horse trainers of the Twentieth Century."

He and his wife, the former Edna HOFFMAN CURTIS, lived in Fulton before moving to this city in 1966. Mrs. Christiansen also is a Circus Hall of Fame member and her election in January of this year marked the first time a married couple had been so honored. Mrs. Christiansen was an outstanding horsewoman and circus promoter during a 47-year career.

Sgt. Ameigh lived with his parents, John E. and Josie SPRING AMEIGH, at Disko east of Akron while he attended school. The family moved to Mountain View, Ark., before the sergeant went into the service.
