Veronica V. Bonnell and Joyce A. Campbell

Two Cass county women were killed and three children injured shortly after 4:30 p.m. Thursday when their rented airplane struck a tree and crashed into a field one-half mile north of the Fulton county airport, east of Rochester. The crash occurred as the plane was attempting to land.

The single-engine, four-place Piper Warrior plane crashed into a cornfield owned by Charles RAUSCHKE, R.R. 2, Rochester. The cause of the crash is undetermined. Officials of the Federal Aviation Agency were investigating the scene today.

Killed instantly was the pilot, Mrs. Veronica V. BONNELL, 34. One of her passengers, Mrs. Joyce A. CAMPBELL, 30, died at 5:52 o'clock in the emergency room of Woodlawn hospital. Both women died from massive head and internal injuries.

Injured, but reported in satisfactory condition today in Woodlawn hospital, were Mrs. Campbell's daughter, Tina [CAMPBELL], 12, Mrs. Bonnell's daughter, Annette [BONNELL], 14, and Mrs. Bonnell's son, Daren [BONNELL], 6.

All five are from Royal Center, where Mrs. Campbell was a member of the town board.

Both women were pinned in the wreckage when rescuers arrived while the children were standing away from the plane, police said. Mrs. Campbell was freed and rushed to Woodlawn hospital with the children.

Mrs. Bonnell, who was the American Party candidate for state senator from District 18 (including Fulton county) last November, was pinned beneath the engine. Authorities were unable to free her until about 5 o'clock.

A wrecker, operated by Max SHULTZ of Shutz's Body Shop, was hooked to the front of the plane while a tractor deiven by Rauschke was hooked to the rear to free Mrs. Bonnell's body.

The children all suffered multiple lacerations, abrasions and contusions, police said.

Authorities said the plane, owned by the Logansport Flying Service, left Logansport shortly after 4 o'clock. It is believed the group was coming to Rochester for dinner.

According to witnesses, the plane made its landing apprach from the west, but began to drift northward. The plane did not gain enough altitude to clear a tree which stands 45 feet north of the ConRail railroad tracks and it crashed into the field 246 feet from the tree.

Investigating the tragedy were members of the Indiana state police, assisted by the Fulton county police department, the Rochester police and fire departments and the Kewanna fire department.

The bodies of the two women were taken from Zimmerman Brothers funeral home here to the Harrison funeral home in Kewanna. An autopsy has been scheduled for Mrs. Bonnell.

The last plane crash in Fulton county was Dec. 12, 1973, when two local men, Josief B. CARDONA and Robert R. BENECKI, were killed when their plane crashed east of the city. In July, 1972, four Cincinnati natives were killed when their craft came down north of Kewanna. In 1960, three men died when their plane crashed east of Rochester.

Dale H. BOWYER, 25, R.R. 1, Akron, was pronounced dead at the scene from a broken neck when his Datson pickup truck, which was crossing the southbound lane of U.S. 31, struck the semi-rig.

County police said the Bowyer truck was southbound on Old U.S. 31 and had apparently stoped before crossing the northbound lane of U.S. 31. BOWYER apparently did not see the semi-rig before pulling into the Southbound lane.

The driver of the semi-rig, Robert L. CROSS, 47, New Albany, told police he was unable to avoid the collision. The semi-rig is owned by Courier-Newsom Express of Lafayette.

Damage was \$1,200 to the pickup and \$500 to the semi-rig.

The fatality was the first at the intersection since the Rochester bypass ection of dual-laned U.S. 31 was opened on May 25, 1973.

The last traffic fatality in Fulton county was last Oct. 28 when Rodney LEWIS, 16, R.R. 5, Rochester, died from injuries sustained in a two-car crash two days earlier. Alan BLUE, 19, Mentone, also died from injuries sustained in that crash - on Ind. 25 at County Road 100 South.

Oliver Godfroy

Peru, Ind. (AP) - A funeral service was scheduled today for a descendant of one of the last war chiefs of the Miami Indians.

Oliver "Swimming Turtle" GODFROY, 79, who died Saturday, made the news last month when he won a three-year-old lawsuit in U.S. district court in South Bend, ordering refund of a half-century of property taxes.

At the time, Godfroy, whose Indian name was Swimming Turtle, said, "They're going to try to hold it up as long as they can. They figure I'll die, and the case might drop."

The injunction granted in South Bend prohibits Miami county from collecting property taxes on 79 acres of farmland east of Peru. Judge Allen SHARP also ruled Godfroy was entitled to a refund of taxes paid on the property since 1923.

The ruling is expected to be appealed.

Godfroy, great-grandson of Chief Francis GODFROY, said he had willed the land to his niece so it would remain in Indian hands.

In his suit, he claimed an exeption from taxes under Article 3 of the Northwest Ordinance passed by the Continental Congress under the Articles of Confederation.

The judge noted that descendants of Chief Godfroy have held title to the land since the federal government relinquished control in 1849 in accordance with the Treaty of the Forks of the Wabash. It was signed by Francis Godfroy and President Andrew Jackson.

Sharp said Swimming Turtle "made every reasonable effort consistent with the realities of modern society to maintain his status as an Indian."

His tax exempt status was "a vested right which cannot be taken by the State of Indiana or its political subdivisions without just compensation," Sharp added.

The treaty originally allotted 2,500 tax-free acres of Wabash river bottomland to the Miami Indians. Despite this, county officials insisted Swimming Turtle pay property taxes, which he did but under protest.

In recent years, when Indian tribes in the eastern United States organized, money from such groups as the Rockefeller, Ford and Lilly foundations made it possible to take the fight to court.

Godfroy said he did not remember how much he paid in property taxes since 1923, but his original suit asked \$10,000.

"I figured I'd get a decision in my favor," he said. "But I also think the attorney general of Indiana will take it to the appeals court in Chicago. I don't think they can win in any court."

Mr. Barnhart was editor and publisher of The Sentinel from 1913-19, following in the footsteps of his father, Henry A. BARNHART, who then was serving as a U.S. Congressman. For almost 30 years he pursued a news career, having been reporter and night city editor of The South Bend News-Times in 1911-12. He moved from Rochester to become editor, business manager and co-publisher of The Goshen News-Democrat from 1919-38.

Mr. Barnhart compiled a varied career that also encompassed athletic achievements as well as those of business and public service.

A 1907 graduate of Rochester high school, he was a member of the first RHS basketball and baseball teams and went on to Indiana university, where he obtained an A.B. degree, cum laude, in 1911. At I.U. he was a member of the varsity basketball team from 1908-11 and captained the team in 1909-10.

Active in the university's campus affairs, Mr. Barnhart was a co-organizer of the I.U. Memorial Student Union and served as its second president. He also was a member of I.U's first journalism class and a charter member of its Sigma Delta Pi professional journalism fraternity chapter. A member of Delta Tau Delta social fraternity and Phi Beta Kappa at I.U., he retained his interest in the university and its alumni affairs throughout his life.

In 1968, he was given a Distinguished Alumni Service Award for his long record of activities with the I.U. Emeritus club, Alumni Association, I.U. Varsity Club and the I Men's Association.

He followed his interest in athletics after graduation by refereeing high school and college basketball for 13 yars and becoming golf champion of the Rochester country club in 1918, having helped organize that club.

Also active in Democratic politics, Mr. Barnhart was unsuccessful candidate for state representative and state senator in 1928 and 1930, respectively, while residing in Goshen. He was a frequent delegate to Democratic state conventions, served as Goshen party chairman, managed the Indiana presidential campaign of New York's Averill Harriman in 1952, and served as presidet of the Indiana Democratic Editorial Association.

He also was a co-founder and member of the first board of directors of the Hoosier State Press Association in 1934.

From 1953-67, he was director of education for the Indiana Division on Alcoholism of the Department of Mental Health at Indianapolis. He was active for over 20 years in the effort to assist alcoholics achieve sobriety, participating in group endeavors, working with the afflicted and writing and speaking. He contributed many articles on alcoholism to periodicals and newspapers.

In this work, Mr. Barnhart founded the Workshop on Problems of Alcoholism and Alcohol Education at Indiana university, helped found the Indianapolis Flynn Christian Fellowship Home, and also was actively associated with the work of Alcoholics Anonymous groups throughout the state.

His work in this field was recognized in 1963 when he was made a Sagamore of the Wabash by Gov. Matthew Welsh.

While a Goshen resident, Mr. Barnhart served as Red Cross chapter chairman, trustee of the public library and of the city hospital.

He was a former director of the Rochester Telephone company, served as utility service director of the Indiana Public Service Commission and was public relations director of Clifty Falls State Park at Madison. He also was employed as an investment counselor for St. Louis and New York firms while an Indianapolis residet.

Born in Rochester on April 22, 1889, he was the son of Henry and Louretta BARNHART. His marriage was in 1914 to Louise BEANE of Goshen, who died May 8, 1971.
