Markham C. "Mark" WAKEFIELD of Bloomington and Rochester, a member of the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame, died Saturday in Bloomington Hospital at the age of 89.

A former high school coach at Rochester, Switz City, Bloomington, Evansville Central and Indianapolis Arsenal Teck, Wakefield owned a farm at the "Twin Bridges" at the end of West Sixth Street Road in Fulton County.

He retired to that farm in 1961 after being chairman of the former Department of Physical Education for Men at Indiana University in Bloomington since 1946.

However, it was only a semi-retirement for Wakefield, who continued to serve I.U. as associate professor of physical education until 1966.

Wakefield came to Rochester High School as head basketball coach in 1920 and during his one season here he led the Zebras to the 16-team finals of the state tournament. RHS lost by 18-17 to Franklin's "Wonder Five" in a game that Franklin players remembered in later years as their toughest game ever.

As an Indiana high school coach, Wakefield's teams won 18 sectional titles in 23 years, took 15 regional championships and advanced to the state finals seven times. The state crown eluded him, however.

He was elected to the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 1969 along with another former RHS coach, Clyde LYLE.

Wakefield was president in 1935 of the Indiana High School Coaches Association, and recipient of its honor award in 1951; president of the Indiana Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation in 1948, and winner of its honor award in 1952, and national president of Sigma Delta Psi honorary athletic society from 1959-63.

Born in Switz City, Wakefield received an undergraduate degree from I.U. in 1920, winning a varsity letter in basketball in his senior year. He received a master's degree in education from Columbia University in 1932 and a doctorte in education from I.U. in 1944.

In Bloomington, he was a member of the First Baptist United Church of Christ and the Downtown Kiwanis Club. He was a Mason and a member of the Scottish Rite.
