When it came to collecting antique clocks and phonographs, Mark Jay Clemans had an eye for detail and a knack for getting what he wanted.

In his senior year of high school, Clemans coveted a tall antique wall clock in the school assembly hall.

Before the school shut its doors for good during his graduating year, the budding collector had saved enough money to purchase the clock at the closing auction.

When he couldn't make it to the auction himself, Clemans asked his parents to bid on the clock for him.

"He told them he wanted that clock," said his wife of 40 years, Janeene Clemans. "We've got it in our family room."

The Kissimmee resident and former maintenance engineer at Walt Disney World died Sunday of liver cancer. He was 66.

Clemans was born and raised on a dairy farm in rural Akron.

Small-town life had lent him an easy down-home friendliness toward others, his family said.

"He never knew a stranger. My dad was the kind of guy who smiled at everyone, knew everyone and waved at everyone," said daughter Lisa Clemans of Bonita Springs.

Mark Clemans' interest in antiques began with an appreciation for family heirlooms passed down from past generations.

He was also fond of playing piano and organ, particularly pieces with difficult, fast-paced finger technique, such as Rimsky-Korsakov's "The Flight of the Bumblebee."

He played regularly in church and at home throughout his life.

Clemans' passion for music spurred his interest in collecting antique phonographs and vintage vinyl.

As a chaplain's assistant in the U.S. Army between 1963 and 1966, Clemans once took the rough edges off a two-week survival exercise in the Arizona desert by bringing a crank-up portable phonograph to entertain the group, his wife said.

"He made a lot of friends wherever he went," she said. "He was more like the peacemaker. If something needed to be straightened out, he was the one to do it."

A longtime member of the Michiana Antique Phonograph Society, Clemans gathered a collection that consisted of about a dozen working phonographes and "boxes and boxes" of vintage records.

He also collected about 50 antique clocks that chime on the hour, in addition to antique trains and china.

Lisa Clemans said that when she was younger, her father taught her to play the piano by ear and they often played duets.

In his later years, Clemans relaxed on Sundays by playing the piano, cranking up his old phonographs and tinkering with his clocks.

He preferred dusting off an old vinyl recording and placing it on a vintage turntable to listening to a compact disc on a modern stereo system.

"It just kept him grounded," she said.

1st. SGT. McLOCHLIN DIES IN AFGHANISTAN COMBAT Standout athlete enlisted after 1979 RHS graduation; served as Ranger, then in Guard

Rochester native, Plymouth policeman and Indiana National Guard 1st Sgt. Jeff McLOCHLIN was killed Wednesday in Afghanistan.

A 1979 graduate of Rochester High School, he is the son of Rochester's Rich and Cindy McLochlin. His father was Fulton County sheriff from 1982 through 1989 and assessor from 1990 through 1994.

1st. Sgt McLochlin leaves three children, Darby, 16; Connor, 8; and Kennedy, 5, and his wife, Nicholle.

McLochlin left Sept. 18, 2005, for a 365-day deployment in Afghanistan. He was a senior noncommissioned officer of his Winchester-based mechanized infantry unit.

He had been home nine months from his previous deployment. That was January 2004 through November 2004, as part of a NATO peacekeeping mission in Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Mrs. McLochlin knows only this: While on patrol, McLochlin's group received small arms fire from an anti-government element of unknown size, she said.

During the engagement he was wounded, and he died while being evacuated. She said her husband was close to the Afghanistan-Pakistan border.

He was embedded with the Afghan National Army as a trainer.

In the Indiana National Guard, McLochlin was assigned to the 83rd Infantry Division, but when he left in September, "he shipped out of Colorado with people from all over the country," Mrs. McLochlin said.

Recently, he was stationed at Forward Operating Base Tillman, at Lwara, Afghani-stan. Mrs. McLochlin said she had trouble keeping track of his whereabouts the past couple of months.

McLochlin was a standout Zebra athlete, lettering in football, basketball and track.

He joined the Army and served four years active duty with the 2nd Ranger Battalion. He married the former Tish Sriver, daughter of Gary and Tammy Sriver, Akron, and Darby was born.

He joined the Indiana National Guard in 1991.

He eventually became a police officer, following in the footsteps of his father, a former Fulton County sheriff.

Jeff McLochlin was a Rochester City Police patrolman from March 29, 1993, to March 13, 1999. He married Nicholle in 1996.

McLochlin worked for the Rochester Police Department as a patrol officer from March 29, 1993, to March 13, 1999.

"He was a good, strong kid," Rochester Police Chief Greg Halfast said this morning. "He was always dedicated and always doing his job."

"You don't realize how close it can get. This brings it home for sure," Halfast said.

McLochlin moved to the Plymouth Police Department, where he was a patrolman, in 1999.

Plymouth Police Chief Jim Cox said the department was notified of McLochlin's death early Wednesday evening in a call from McLochlin's family.

"We were looking forward to his return in September," Cox said.

Plymouth police officers "will be wearing a black band over their badge in honor of McLochlin," Cox wrote in a press release.

Plymouth Mayor Greg Cook had ordered flags on city buildings to be flown at half-staff in McLochlin's honor.

His brother, John, a member of the RHS Class of 1981, could not attend a class reunion this weekend because of his own military commitments. John McLochlin joined the U.S. Army after high school and recently was stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas, flying Blackhawk helicopters.
